

Project Development

Information gathered through scientific inventory and assessment of species and habitat is combined with local input and knowledge to develop and implement conservation projects. The WLCI holds regular Local Project Development Team meetings, where public participation is needed and expected.

Types of projects developed to date include

- ***Fencing***
- ***Wetland creation***
- ***Prescribed burns***
- ***Riparian enhancements***
- ***Weed treatments***
- ***River restoration, and***
- ***Conservation easements***
